**Worksheet 15: Imperfect Tense – Basics, Formation, Translation**

I. Basics of the Imperfect Tense:

- The imperfect tense expresses **ongoing/continuous, repeated, or habitual** action **in past time** (past time = time *before* the present)
- The main way to translate the imperfect tense into English is “**was/were \_\_\_\_\_ ing**”
- The imperfect active indicative uses the **personal endings**, just like the present tense–BUT, in the 1<sup>st</sup> SG the imperfect always uses *-m* and never *-ō*
- The **personal endings** of Latin verbs are:

	SG	PL
1 <sup>st</sup>		
2 <sup>nd</sup>		
3 <sup>rd</sup>		

- The imperfect is indicated by the infix **-ba-**
- The imperfect is part of the **present system** of verbs, even though it is a past tense, because it is formed from the present stem.
- The rule for forming the imperfect active indicative of Latin verbs is:
