Vergil, *Aeneid* – English Selections Comprehension & Discussion Questions

<u>Instructions</u>: Please read the assigned text and come to class prepared to discuss the following questions.

N.B.: V. = Vergil / A. = Aeneas / D. = Dido

Recurrent Themes, Motifs, and Other Items To Watch Out For:

- Characterization, especially of Aeneas (as hero, as human being, as survivor of disaster, as refugee, as leader, as pawn of the gods, as embodying Roman values, etc.)
- Vergil's use of speeches and similes—how they contribute to characterization, what they add to the narrative, etc.
- Portrayal and embodiment of traditional Roman values: pietas, virtūs, gravitās, constantia, etc.
- The role and description of 'the city' throughout, especially how Troy itself resonates through the epic (the *urbs capta* motif will be particularly prominent in this work, since Troy was the original *urbs capta* in Greco-Roman antiquity)
- The depiction of war, especially how Vergil works in elements that call to mind civil wars and other, more recent events from Roman history
- Divine intervention and the role of the gods, as well as the role of fate/destiny
- The role of history and memory
